CASA Volunteer Training

Volunteer to be the difference between abuse and hope—become a Court-Appointed Special Advocate (CASA). These volunteers give their time to advocate for abused and neglected children in the court system. The need for CASA volunteers continues to grow—181 child-in-need-of-care cases were filed in Riley, Clay and Pottawatomie counties during 2009. There were only enough CASA volunteers to be assigned to 63 of the children involved with these cases. Volunteer training will begin on Monday, Feb. 8, from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. and will continue on Monday evenings through March 29 (There will be no training on March 15 due to K-State's spring break).
